The only surviving part of Winchester Castle, once home to the Domesday Book, this 13th century hall was the centre of court and government life. The Round Table, closely associated with the legendary King Arthur, has hung here for over 700 years. Visit Queen Eleanor's Garden and the exhibition depicting the history of Winchester Castle. Available for weddings and private functions.

## 6. Winchester Cathedral, The Refectory and Gift Shop

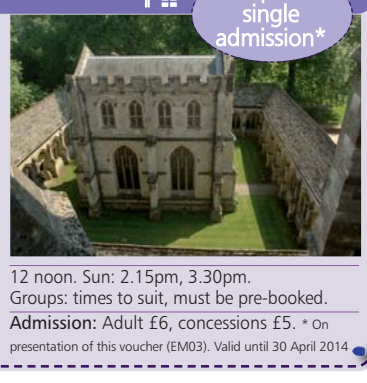

## 7. Winchester College

Founded in 1382, Winchester College is believed to be the oldest continuously-running school in England. Guided tours and group visits are available year round and include Chamber Court, the 14th century gothic Chapel, the original Scholars' dining room, the 17th century red brick schoolroom, and the original Cloister.

## 20. God Begot House



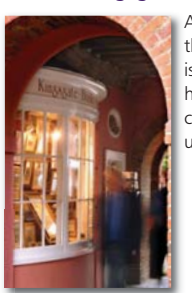
Look down Royal Oak Passage to see the 16th century origins of this half-timbered building, now a pizza restaurant, on the site of Queen Emma's manor. Lloyds TSB Bank opposite occupies the old guildhall.

## 19. Buttercross



Winchester's familiar 15th century city cross. A narrow passage leads from it to Great Minster Street, passing the almost hidden church of St Lawrence-in-the-Square.

## 18. The Kingsgate



Above the archways of this surviving city gate is one of Winchester's hidden gems, the tiny church of St Swithun-upon-Kingsgate.

## 17. Jane Austen's House



Now a private residence, Austen lived here for the last six weeks of her life and died on 18 July 1817. She is buried in the cathedral.

## 16. Cheyney Court



A highly photographed half-timbered beauty, and former bishop's court house.

## 12. Abbey House and Gardens



The mayor's official residence. On the site of a nunaminster founded by King Alfred's wife, Queen Ealhswith.



## 15. Pilgrims' Hall

Adjacent to Pilgrims' School, Pilgrims' Hall, where pilgrims to the shrine of St Swithun were lodged, dates from 1308 and has a fine hammer-beam roof.

## 11. King Alfred the Great

Scholar, soldier, statesman, King Alfred restored Winchester after the Dark Ages and made the city his capital. His striking bronze statue dominates the Broadway.



## 14. The Deany and Dean Garnier Garden

Between the cathedral and the Deany, which has been continuously occupied since the 13th century, this delightful Victorian garden has been recreated to reflect the cathedral architecture.

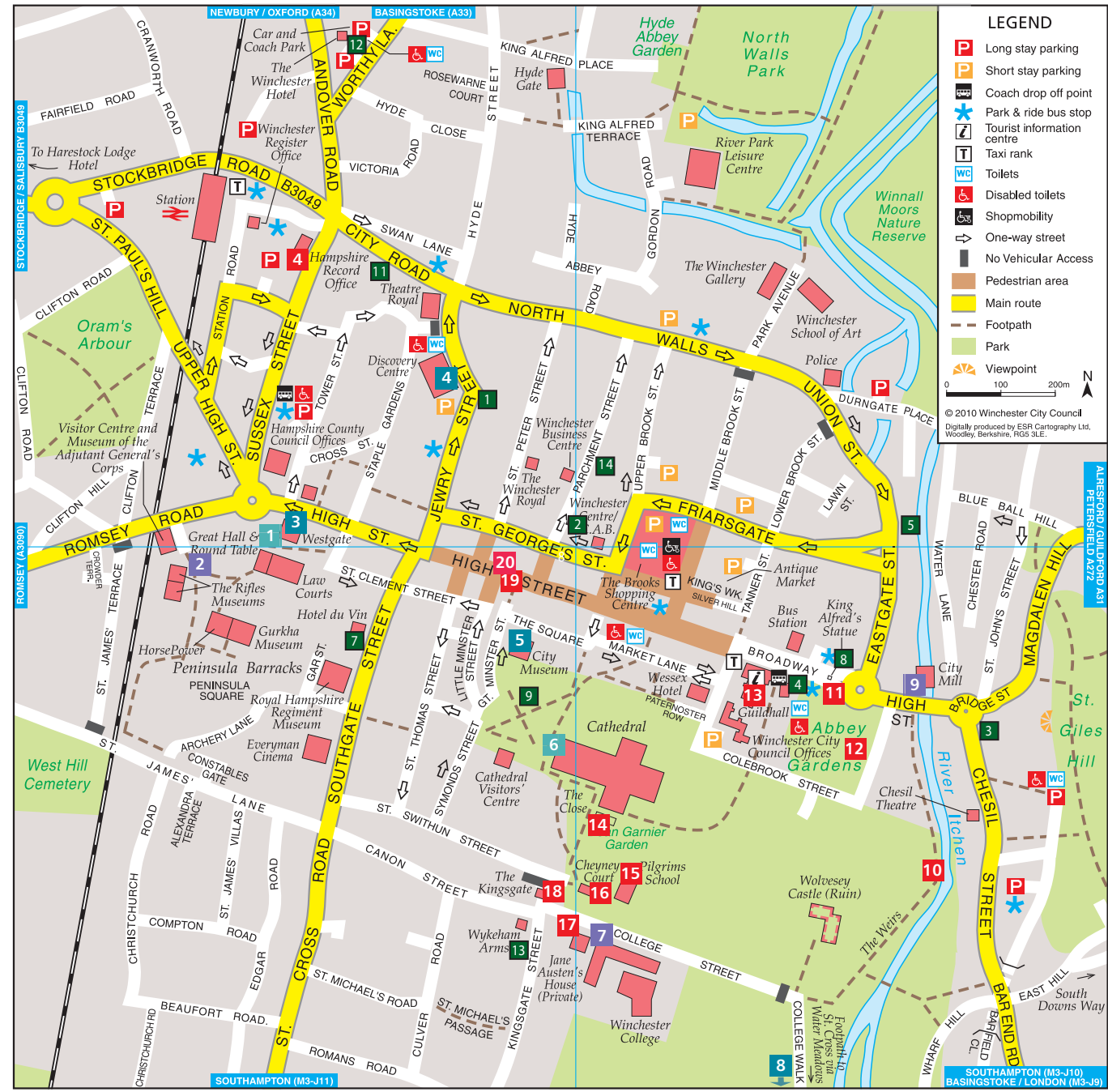
## 10. River Itchen and Weirs Walk

Fast-flowing and famous for its trout. Stroll across City Bridge, the river's ancient crossing place and entrance to the city, and follow the Weirs Walk to the water meadows and St Cross. Go via Wolvesey Castle – the extensive ruins of the medieval bishop's palace (open 1 April–1 Oct).



## 13. Guildhall Winchester

An imposing gothic building, the recently refurbished Victorian Guildhall is a civic and conference centre. A café and the tourist information centre are on the ground floor.



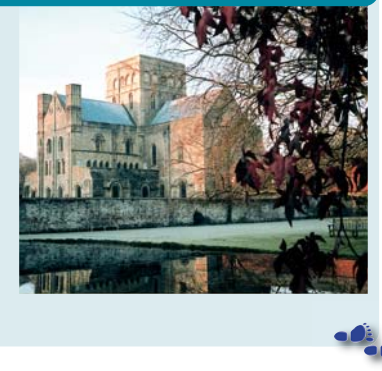

Nov - Mar: Mon-Sat, 10.30am-3.30pm.

National Trust shop offers local produce and seasonal gifts. Milling demonstrations Sat & Sun 11am-4pm & every Wed 11am-4pm (May to Oct) plus baking demonstrations on selected days.
